

Christmas Candy I

Fabric requirements for one block:

One fat eighth of background fabric 8 Charm Pre-cuts and scraps or all scraps.

Cutting:

From Scraps cut:

8 – 4"x 4" Square A 8 to 16 – 1"x 4" Strip B


From Background fabric cut:

4 – 3 ½" x 6 ½" Rectangle C





Sewing:


- 1. Cut a Square A across once or twice (as shown) and sew one or two contrasting Strip B's in between as indicated. *Make sure cuts are at least 1" away from the edges and 3/4" away from each other.*
- 2. Trim "candy" block to 3 ½" x 3 ½" square. Make 8 of these, varying the space between strips and number of strips in each block.
- 3. Sew the candy blocks and the Rectangle C's varying the orientation of the strips (vertical or horizontal) as shown:



Mix prints and solids in abandon in this project. Also remember they don't just have to be Christmas colors or fabrics for the same holiday feel.







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
